

DoYou Know Me ?

Heard of Pine Sewing Machines?


What you are looking at here is a Pine 500 Hand Cranked sewing machine. Looks familiar but you've never heard of a Pine Sewing Machine? This little stitcher is the very first



sewing machine created by a brand that you'll all know today as Janome. Released for domestic sale in 1921, it is widely speculated that this is the first ever sewing machine made in Japan. The Pine Sewing Machine Factory was established in Tokyo in 1921. 8 years later in 1929, the next Pine machine, the Pine 100, came to the market and introduced a bobbin to the sewing machine. With the enormous success of this innovation, Pine Sewing Machine company changed its name to Janome. Why? (and this is pretty cool, actually) The word Janome means "eye of the snake" in Japanese, and came about because the Pine 100's new bobbin had an appearance similar to a snake's eye. Pine embraced this well-used nick-name for their sewing machine, and even added snake embellishments to the model.
